^ Sow seeds in biodegradable pots that can be planted directly in the ground

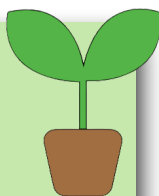
Start Seeds Outside

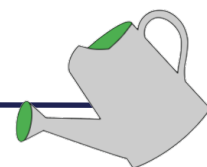

Garden Maintenance



- Add compost to beds
- Divide ornamental grasses
- Have cold frames or row covers handy to cover new seedlings and transplants
- Transplant seedlings to larger pots if needed
- Hill up potatoes
- Thin garden seedlings



WATER

- Water fall-seeded flowers and wild flowers in absence of rain
- Check seedlings daily
- maintain moderate moisture for herbs and cool-season vegetables
- Water annual flowers as needed

CARE

- Fertilize Irises for better blooms
- Fertilize seedlings with diluted fish emulsion or seaweed extract
- Check cool-season crops for pests and treat as needed
- Pull young weeds
